# Drug intolerance among young Poles

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
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#### 1. Increasing drug consumption in Poland

Poland is one of the fastest growing markets of drugs, and it is predicted that this trend will continue in future years.



### 4. Methods (cntd)

- skin prick test with common allergens
- total IgE level
- Phadiatop
- medical examination for asthma, allergic rhinitis, dermatitis, and urticaria







#### 2. Study settings

During a nationwide study of vocational students' health status, history of drug intolerance was collected in a random sample of 134 students aged 16-23.

#### 5. Results

13 persons (9.7%, 95%CI: 4.7-14.7%) reported episodes of drug intolerance ever in their lives.

#### 3. Methods

The physicianadministered questionnaire included the question
"Have you ever had adverse reactions after taking any medicine?"

#### 6. Results

We were not able to identify any risk factor for drug intolerance among atopy markers, allergic disease and gender.
